

How to: SawStop Table Saw

Safety First!!!

Table Saw Uses:

- Ripping stock to width
- Squaring or crosscutting
- Dado and grooving
- Rabbeting
- Angle cutting and mitering

Rules for Use:

- NEVER put green or wet wood through the SawStop
- ALWAYS check for and remove nails, screws, other conductive metal embedded in wood.
- DO NOT process any wood with people standing directly in back of you. Ask them to move.

Safety Considerations:

- 1. Eye Protection
- 2. Use guards at all times.
- 3. Always use a push stick for narrow stock (under 6" in width).
- 4. Always stand to the left and to the rear when cutting.
- 5. DO NOT reach over or behind the saw blade.
- 6. Always push stock into fence applying pressure IN FRONT of the blade.
- 7. Always push the piece between the fence and the blade.
- 8. Always use the miter gauge or crosscut sled when crosscutting to length.
- 9. Do not use cutoff or miter gauge when using the fence unless gauge will pass between the fence and the blade.
- 10. Do not raise the blade any higher than 1/4" above the work.
- 11. Make all machine adjustments with the power off (fence, blade, guards, jigs, etc.)
- 12. Give the machine your undivided attention while operating it.
- 13. Be sure fence is secured before starting your operation.
- 14. Keep saw table free from litter.
- 15. Do not attempt to pick up or brush away pieces of waste next to the blade with your hands.

Always turn on the dust collection vacuum when using the SawStop Table Saw.
